Notes of the WERA Special Committee Meeting held on Wednesday, 1st of June 2016 at 7pm in the WERA Clubroom, 16 Blantyre Street

1 In Attendance:

WERA – Margaret Grayling (Chair), Monica Boholst, Jules Montero.

Others – Thomas Baylis (RBK&C/LBH&F Recycling Department).

2 Key points of discussion:

TB briefed the meeting on recent efforts by his team to engage with residents on TMO-managed property, this included holding recycling events at Trellick Tower and Lancaster West, and door-knocking/delivering leaflets on both estates.

TB stated that the recycling team had the following activities planned for World's End:

1. A door-knocking/leaflet-drop exercise on the estate, which would be scheduled take place as soon as the relevant recycling information leaflets were ready for delivery.
2. Participating in the Big Local Summer Event on the Piazza, at which the recycling team hoped to have a table from which to distribute information leaflets and recycling bags.
3. Scheduling a date for the collection of electrical items for recycling from the estate. This was expected to take place after the Big Local Summer Event.

It was suggested that TB make contact with the TMO's resident engagement team when organising any events on the estate. TB's team might then be able to make use of events already planned by the TMO (e.g. the TMO's "Roadshow" events).

There was a brief discussion with regards to:

1. Supplying "proper" recycling bags to residents.
2. The current state of the recycling bins on the estate and in particular whether contamination of some of the existing bins was a serious problem. TB said he would investigate.
3. The reinstatement of the bins outside the Co-op following the completion of works on the Kings Road. TB stated that these would be reinstated once the works were complete.
4. Whether it might be possible to supply the World's End Nursery with their own recycling bin given that they seemed to be using the estate's recycling bins. TB said he would investigate.
5. Whether TB's team could investigate the possibility of reinstating some of the recycling bins that had previously been located outside Chelsea Reach and Greaves Towers.
